## World History


Grades: 10-12

This is a 1 credit course.

Prerequisites: Students should complete Basic Composition or equivalent class before beginning this course. They should be able to write clear, short paragraphs to answer homework and exam questions and to complete a full essay with a works cited page for each semester project.

Tuition: \$160 (1/2 due at registration, 1/2 due at first day of classes).

Text: We will use the BJU Press *World History* book intended for high school. Used versions are fine, and the third, fourth and fifth editions are all acceptable.



(Shown are the 5<sup>th</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup>, and 3<sup>rd</sup> editions of the text. You may choose from any of these, as you find availability.)

Description: This class will essentially be a "lite" western civilization course, with specific focus on the ideas and worldviews that have contributed to shaping our modern world and society. We will examine how the beliefs of the past influenced the behavior of nations and civilizations, and what consequences flowed from those ideas. Students will learn to analyze and evaluate these philosophies and their outcomes on a high school level.

Homework time: Students can expect to spend at least 3-4 hours a week completing homework for this course. Short quizzes will be held periodically. Exams will be short answer and given as take-home tests. Each semester, students will complete a project on an approved world history topic, which will include an essay and a presentation.
